<u>Fearless Faith</u> – We are Unapologetically Catholic. Our faith is living and vibrant and permeates all we are and do. Each part of the Monday night Religious Education is an active response to faith: As catechists we are committed to pray before and even after RE sessions. The catechists pray with the children each time they meet together. Our Catholic faith is interwoven into every aspect of our curriculum, our discipline and our culture. We celebrate throughout the year with visits with Father Jim, Reconciliation, teaching Masses, Sacrament Retreat days and Sacrament celebrations, as well as visits to the Eucharistic Chapel.

<u>Catechetics</u> -- We are dedicated to providing your children the best possible catechetical and spiritual experience: We affirm the gifts of each student. We offer open lines of communication between you and your child's catechist, as well as with Tim Horst, Director of Faith Formation, and Father Jim Chelich. After your child's Confirmation in 8th grade, it is Father Jim's hope and desire that this is not viewed as "graduation" but just the beginning of their journey in the Church. We offer a weekly Youth Ministry opportunity for high-schoolers so that they are able to continue their faith journey with their peer community here at Saint Thomas. Our Catechists are committed to making sure that they themselves are formed and informed as catechists to help pass the faith along to your child.

Your Commitment – Ensure that your child attends weekly Monday night Religious Education and that any homework is completed to the best of their ability, and they have opportunities of quiet times of Prayer and Scripture reading.
